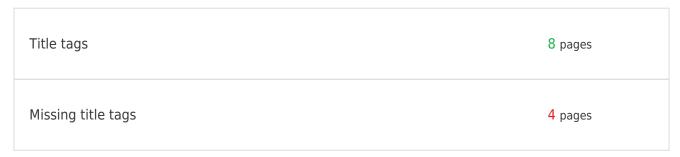

Why is this important?

Redirecting too many of your site's pages to other pages may cause search engines to cover less of your site when they come to crawl its content.

If you need to redirect some of your pages, configure your server to return a "301" or permanent redirect instead of a "302" temporary redirect.



Redirects waste crawler resources. The more efficiently a search engine crawler can cover your site, the more likely you are to have all your pages indexed.

A well structured, well linked site helps search engine crawlers cover your site more completely. Search engine crawlers tend to start by visiting the most popular pages on the web, then following the links on those pages to discover other pages. They may not find those that are deeply nested, have no links at all, or are reached through multiple redirects.

Reachability also makes it easy for your visitors to find what they are looking for, providing them with a better experience.

What is this topic about?

Why is this important?

Duplicate content across different pages on your website leads to poor placement in search results.

No action needed -- all your pages have unique content.



Common types of duplicate pages are printable or text-only versions of the main page. They may also result when a crawler tries to access a URL that requires a visitor to sign in, and is redirected to your login page.

Make sure popular pages remain available to crawlers. Search engines use these popular pages for ranking purposes. For example, if the printable version of a page is most popular, consider keeping that and restricting crawler access to the less popular version. Just make sure it's not a dead end page.

You can alert search engine crawlers that a page is a duplicate version by adding a link tag in the head section of the HTML of the web page. The URL in the href should point to the canonical page:

<head><link rel="canonical" href="http://www.yoursite.com/canonicalurl" /></head>

A more technically complex way of alerting crawlers to duplicate pages can be implemented at the server level. By including a Content-Location entity-header field in the HTTP headers, you can communicate to a crawler that a given URL is a duplicate version of another page on your site. Your webmaster can find additional information about this approach on the w3 website.

Shorter URLs are also easier to share through social media services like Twitter and Facebook.

Anchor Text

What is this topic about?

Link text that appears on a web page (often in a different color), which looks like this in HTML: This is the anchor text

Why is this important?

Search engines use anchor text to help decide what the destination page is about.

Recommended Action

Where possible, replace generic text such as "click here" with phrases that describe the page being linked to.



Giving the links on your site descriptive, keyword-rich anchor text may help search engines recognize the destination page's value, leading to better visibility in search engine results.

Too many links on a page can negatively impact how search engines assess the quality of the page, and can make your site harder to navigate.

What is this topic about?

The amount of text on your website.

Why is this important?

Pages with little or no text content often receive poor placement in search results.

Recommended Action

Add more text content to any pages on this list that you want to appear higher in search results. Make sure the additional words are relevant to the page.



When you include ample text content on your pages, search engines can more easily tell that they contain information relevant to particular searches. Search engine crawlers can't recognize words in a graphic, so text in an image doesn't count.

For pages that you don't want to appear in search results, low word counts don't matter.
